Project Abstract: Surveys of the potential sighting of a new Infantry Platoon battle Course on the Western side of Pohakuloa Training Area are required to prepare for completion of a NEPA documents and for Section 7 consultation under the Federal Endangered Species Act. Planning Level Surveys indicate that there is a high likelihood that T&E are in the proposed IPBC footprint, therefore, surveying is required. If surveys are not completed, completion of NEPA and Section 7 for this proposed range will be delayed and the units in Hawaii will continue to suffer throughput issues as a result of insufficient training areas.
