**Project Abstract:** The primary objectives of this project are to assist USAG FWA with the optimal management of training lands, to minimize restrictions to the military mission due to natural and cultural resource related constraints, to protect and enhance biological diversity and ecological health on all USAG FWA lands, and to ensure compliance with all environmental laws and regulations. This study is helps fulfill requirements under both Section 106 and Section 110 of the National Historic Preservation Act. Specific objectives are as follows:

- (1) Conduct Phase II archaeology surveys (site evaluations) to support construction activities. Estimated number of evaluations is 15.
- (2) To assemble, edit, summarize, analyze, interpret, and apply archaeological data to the management of cultural resources on military installations. This is accomplished most efficiently with state-of-the-art computer analyses and on-site technical expertise. All results will be compiled into a final report.
