Hill encompasses approximately 76,000 acres of land in Caroline County, Virginia and provides military training in explosives, combat, navigation and orienteering, demolition, engineering, parachuting, and equipment drops. To ensure compliance with Army Regulation (AR) 200-1, Cultural Resources, Fort A.P. Hill requires assistance to conduct cultural resources surveys of proposed forestry blocks and to provide cultural resources training to installation personnel.
