Project Abstract: The 1997 thesis, "Ramparts of Sand: An Environmental History of Great Sand Dunes National Monument and the San Luis Valley" (Colorado State University, 181 pp.) is the most thorough history of GRSA to date. Yet this valuable document was completed before the establishment of the national park and preserve. Given the extraordinary natural and cultural significance of GRSA, an expansion of Geary's manuscript into a complete, publishable, administrative history of the park and preserve is not only warranted, but necessary. Therefore, this project will update the environmental history of Great Sand Dunes National Monument to reflect the elevated status of the site from monument to national park/preserve and to serve as the official NPS administrative history of GRSA. This work will provide a narrative foundation for public and governmental understanding of GRSA and will create a publishable manuscript that GRSA staff and researchers can use to pursue publication with a scholarly press, the WNPA, or an independent publisher.
