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**Project Abstract:** The goal of this project is to implement a teacher workshop at the Kaloko-Honokahau National Historic Park (KAHO). HAHO has significant water resource issues related to development. The project connects teacher and students to water issues in the park and to their cultural heritage. Colorado State University has developed natural resource curriculum and activities through a previous task agreement and tested then with teachers in the region at a pilot teacher workshop. Using feedback from the workshop, materials were refined. Through this task agreement, CSU would conduct an additional teacher workshop to expand the number of teachers familiar with the curriculum and activities.
