Project Abstract: The collaborative project of this agreement between Colorado State University's (CSU) Public Lands History Center (PLHC) and National Park Service (NPS) will assist Yellowstone National Park (YELL) with finalizing a National Register Multiple Property Documentation Form (MPDF) and National Register eligibility determinations for structures constructed during the Mission 66 era, while giving CSU PLHC students hands-on experience in documenting historic properties according to 3 State Historic Preservation Offices (SHPO) and National Register standards. The project entails the completion of cultural property forms, which are the vehicle through which agencies and SHPOs concur on determinations of National Register eligibility (DOE). This project would constitute the third and final phase of the Yellowstone Mission 66 Resources project.
