Dates: 1919-1993

**Proveneance:** Architectural Drawings of Concessionaire Buildings throughout Yellowstone National park, mainly focusing on Mammoth Hot Springs, Old Faithful, Canyon and Lake Village.

**Physical Description**: The drawings were stored in cabinets in a damp basement of a boiler room. There are many tears and rips in the drawings. There are about 5,000 drawings.

Subjects: The rolls were cataloged and included Lake Girls Dorm 1924-1950, Lake Misc. 1924+, Lake are plats and topography 1940-1960, Lake hotel, lodge, cabin plans 1928-1950; Mammoth Laundry new and old 1929-1958, Mammoth Misc. 1929-1958, Mammoth Hotel, Dining room, terrace Hill 1936+, Mammoth Hotel, lounge, Recreation hall, Cottages 1936; Old Faithful Lodge, plats, profiles and topography 1929-1940, Old Faithful Lodge Misc. 1931-1961; Liquefied petroleum gas installation 1960, G.X. kit phase 2, MHS, Lake, OF, CV, asbestos abatement and sprinkler system 1986, CV Cascade Lodge 1990/1993 NPS; Building Plots 1929-1952, Yellowstone Misc. resident Houses, Yellowstone plots- mostly hotel and lodges 1930, Yellowstone plots 1929-1960; Old Faithful Inn, org. Building 1919-1956, Old Faithful Camps 1935-1960, Old Faithful Inn West Wing 1923-1950; Canyon Hotel plans- panel rooms 1924-1934, Canyon Village Development 1956, Canyon Village Misc. 1957; Canyon Village Main lodge 1956.

**Arrangement**: The rolls were stored in cabinets/boxes and were cataloged and arranged according to this. Many were not cataloged.

**Restrictions**: Some may be considered fragile.

**Locations**: The drawings were in found in the Boiler room of the Xanterra Transportation building in Gardiner, Montana. They were stored in cabinets.


**Condition:** The overall condition of the drawings is fair.

- •The remaining drawings acquired from the Gardiner have been loosely organized according to the place of the architectural drawings. They are currently residing in the Heritage Center awaiting further processing and shipment.





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### Importance of Project for the Park and All Involved:

•Upon our arrival at the park we realized the importance of this project and continued completion. The architectural drawings we retrieved from Gardiner, Montana were located in an old boiler room, surrounded by soot, mold, water, and various old supplies. These drawings were dangerously close to being lost to the park forever, representing some of its original history. These overlooked "too old," "out dated" drawings represent a key to the park's past and by archiving these drawings and preserving them for the future these integral parts of history will never be lost.
