Project Abstract: The Heritage Partnerships Program of the National Park Service, Intermountain Region, will work with the University of Colorado at Denver to prepare the final HABS documentation of Cannonball Pueblo and Margarita Martinez and Senon S. Vigil Homesteads. Recognized as the nation's oldest preservation programs, the Historic American Buildings Survey (HABS), Historic American Engineering Record (HAER), and Historic American Landscape Survey (HALS) programs document important architectural, engineering and landscape sites, utilizing measured drawings, large-format photographs and written histories. The National Park Service, Heritage Partnership Program, is responsible for documenting HABS, HAER and HALS projects which, if approved, are transmitted to the Library of Congress.
