**Project Abstract:** Through this project, the National Park Service, Heritage Preservation Programs branch of the Intermountain Regional Office in Lakewood, CO, will work cooperatively with the University of Colorado-Denver to identify and recruit history students for paid internships working under the HABS (Historic American Buildings Survey, HAER (Historic American Engineering Record) HALS, (Historic American Landscape Record) and NHL (National Historic Landmark) programs. Interns will work with National Park Service (NPS) professional historic preservation staff to complete a variety of HABS, HAER, HALS and NHL documentation projects. Skills required include ability to research and write detailed history reports under various formats and subjects. Not all, but some work will need to be performed at the NPS Intermountain Regional Office in Lakewood. Interns will learn how to complete HABS, HAER, HALS and NHL documentation projects including the use of program-specific writing and research tools.

**Outcomes with Completion Dates:** Start put meeting will occur in spring 2008, with a more detailed scope of work defined at that time. All projects and final reports will be completed by April 15, 2013.
