The purpose of this agreement was for the University of Colorado Denver to assist the NPS in the reviewing, organization, completing partial completed Historic American Buildings Survey/ Historic American Engineering Record/ Historic American Landscape Survey (HABS/HAER/HALS) documentation projects and checking archival materials to insure they meet required program standards.

The project included:

- 1) developing and implementing a plan to review and complete partially completed documentation projects and transmit that information to the HABS/HAER/HALS collection at the Library of Congress;
- 2) developing and implementing a plan to develop a file system and digital map archive for IMR NHL files.

This work was accomplished through a student internship. The student worked in cooperation with NPS staff at the NPS Intermountain Region Office to complete and transmit approximately 25 documentation projects.
