## **Project Abstract:**

Project Goals – This project strives to help the park understand the various types park reservation systems that are available and that may work to address the effects of increased user visitation. The project will also look at park visitation dependent upon the summer and winter seasons, user group, the amount of visitors, and specific to geographical regions to help the park better understand its visitation and whether a reservation system could work to address increased visitation.

Project Objectives – The project will work with Rocky Mountain National Park staff to review and look at various existing visitor reservation systems and implementation plans so the park may better mitigate issues related to increased visitation. The Recipient will determine peak visitation times on a day and seasonal scale with a focus primarily on the eastern side of the park.
