Project Abstract: Recent efforts to revitalize pronghorn research in YELL began with fawn recruitment and habitat use studies, initiated in 1999 and 2000. With those studies drawing to a close, YELL is reviewing the status and direction of its pronghorn program. The Yellowstone Pronghorn Conservation Assessment Workshop was convened in YELL in January, 2002, to appraise the current state of knowledge about this pronghorn population and make recommendations about future management and research needs. A review of pronghorn population change, management, and research in YELL was commissioned in May, 2001, as part of this study, to provide historical background for workshop participants.
