Project Abstract:

The purpose of this project is to continue the interpretation project started in FY 04 with additional funds and time in FY 05:

- \bullet Provide on-site visitor orientation to the evolution of ranching in the American West, the Grant-Kohrs Ranch NHS, and the bunkhouse structure.
- •Provide interpretive text in each bunkhouse room. The interpretive text will be holistic in its total and based on the site's primary interpretive themes.

GRKO is a 1,500-acre historic ranch with 89 historic structures, several housing exhibits, and historically furnished period rooms. The bunkhouse is one of the most interesting buildings on the site. Its historical evolution mirrors the history of the site. It also is where the story of the common person can be told, in comparison to the ranch owners' Victorian home across the driveway.

There is no visitor center on the ranch where visitors can receive an adequate orientation to the history of ranching and how this site fits into that story. There is a vacant "buggy shed" located where most visitors first arrive at the ranch. This is a perfect area to provide that introduction. It is imaged that a "time-line" can be created in bands - the top band would be national events, the 2nd band events at Grant-Kohrs Ranch, and the 3rd band the history of the bunkhouse structure. This project will design and fabricate interpretive displays in the bunkhouse.
