Project Abstract: For over five years, Grant-Kohrs Ranch NHS museum curator and the Principle Investigator have worked together to provide student interns with real-world resource management experience. This Agreement (TA) is for a student intern to conduct initial project planning to re-waxing numerous pieces of historic wood artifact. This two week project will identify what artifacts to re-wax, necessary supplies, logistics of work space and moving artifacts, and safety protocols for workers and artifacts.
