#### Project Abstract:

In FY2005, we will develop a comprehensive study plan with cooperators University of Montana, Yellowstone National Park, USFS-Rocky Mountain Research Station, Gallatin National Forest, Shoshone National Forest, and Wyoming Game and Fish Department. We will initiate wolverine studies in Yellowstone National Park in December 2005. Wolverines will be captured in live-traps and equipped with radio transmitters. Various aspects of wolverine movements, interspecific and intraspecific interactions, and reproductive ecology will be monitored on a year-round basis. Through tactical field studies, the project will provide a variety of essential data on wolverine in context with multiple use lands adjacent to parks. This project will enable managers to identify adverse anthropogenic effects on wolverines, better interpret species life history and values for the public, and begin comprehensive conservation planning on a broad scale with interagency and non-governmental partners.
