**Project Abstract:** The University of Montana will work with Glacier National Park to develop a research design for field documentation and condition assessments of approximately 35 previously identified archeological sites around Sherburne Lake based on data gathered though background research. New sites, both historic and prehistoric, identified during the field work also will be documented.

Researchers will complete Montana Cultural Resources Information System Forms (CRIS) for all previously identified and all new sites. The site forms will comply with Montana State Historic Preservation Office guidelines and procedures. Diagnostics artifacts shall be collected if they are subject to illegal collecting. The University shall catalog and label all collected artifacts using the NPS ANCS+ catalog program. The UM researchers will prepare a final inventory report complying with Montana State Historic Preservation Office guidelines and procedures.

## Outcomes with Completion Dates: Due by February 1, 2008

- 1. Draft and Final Reports: The draft inventory report will be reviewed by NPS staff and discussed with the University. Upon mutual agreement, NPS observations will be incorporated into the documents and final reports will be produced by the University. (Fifteen hard copies and one electronic Microsoft Word File will be submitted).
- 2. Field Records: original or copies of all material associated with the research field notes, research notes, photographs, electronic files, digital images, GIS & GPS data, metadata, notes, etc.- will be provided to Glacier National Park.
- 3. All photo-documentation will be provided as digital images on CD.
