PROJECT SUMMARY:

This project was an extension of the bird survey completed by Gary Swant at Grant-Kohrs Ranch NHS in the spring of 2005. Utah State University hired Gary Swant to develop a birding guide focused on novice bird-watching visitors at Grant-Kohrs NHS. The guide organized the birds based on common habitat types at the ranch and predominant color. The field guide focused on the 60 most common bird species and provided color photos of each. The guide also provided breeding, migration and gives facts about the birds preferred habitat.

The field guide is now available to the visitors to the Grant-Kohrs Ranch. The guide contains a map of the self-guided tours that one can walk. Each habitat is described so that the user understands that different bird species require specific habitats to prosper. The ornithologist will assist with the Tehabi class in May 2005 as part of this USU funding.

In addition to the field guide, Gary Swant participated with the 2005 Tehabi field course as an instructor. He gave a lecture and conducted a field tour of local birds and how to photograph them.

Student Participants: Although students did not directly participate with the development of this field guide, they were a target audience for its production. Over the last few years there has been an increase in the number of students from the Deer Lodge School system on field trips to Grant-Kohrs Ranch NHS to look and learn about birds and their habitats. In addition, Utah State's Tehabi Internship Program has done similar activities at the undergraduate level the last 3 years. This field guide is a direct result of their interests.

Follow-up of this Project – Grant-Kohrs NHS is interested in completing a field guide of the grasses common to Grant-Kohrs Ranch NHS and will submit a proposal in the CESU competition in January 2006.
