Project Abstract: This survey will cover approximately 308.2 acres in Grand Teton National Park and will result in the production of two Class III Cultural Inventory Reports. Areas were selected for survey due to upcoming project work proposed for the respective areas.

The project involves approximately six days of field survey work beginning in August 2011 by two archeologists, including a project director and a crew member. The crew will provide necessary equipment and materials for the survey, and will record and document any prehistoric or historic resources discovered. The cooperator will also conduct a file search on any previously surveyed acres surrounded by or surrounding the survey area. Once the field period is completed, the cooperator will be responsible for completing state site forms and will also make recommendations as to eligibility to the National Register for found resources. This information will be included in the product, a Class III Cultural Resource Inventory report.

The draft report shall be submitted to the Park no later than April 30, 2012, and the final will be submitted May 30, 2012 or four weeks after receipt of NPS comments, whichever is later.
