Project Abstract: University of Wyoming's Wyoming Natural Diversity Database (WYNDD) will conduct porcupine population and habitat survey at Devils Tower National Monument (DETO) to establish baseline data and lay groundwork for monitoring protocol development and citizen science outreach program. WYNDD will use data collected to formalize monitoring protocols, work with DETO staff to develop a citizen science program, and produce a final report.
