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#### **HISTORY**

The idea for Nez Perce National Historical Park originated in two separate causes, or movements. The first movement featured the longstanding efforts of white residents of the Clearwater Valley to commemorate the mid-nineteenth-century activities of Protestant missionaries Henry and Eliza Spalding. The second movement sprang from the efforts of the Nez Perce Tribe to foster job growth on their reservation through tourism development. Beginning about 1961, activists in the two movements began working together toward a common goal of establishing a national historical park. The resulting campaign garnered support from both the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) and the National Park Service (NPS).

Nez Perce National Historical Park was established as a unit of the national park system on May 15, 1965, by Public Law 89-19. The law specifies the park was created to "facilitate protection and provide interpretation of sites in the Nez Perce Country of Idaho that have exceptional value in commemorating the history of the Nation." Specifically mentioned are sites relating to early Nez Perce culture, the Lewis and Clark expedition through the area, the fur trade, missionaries, gold mining, logging, the Nez Perce War of 1877, and "such other sites as will depict the role of the Nez Perce country in the westward expansion of the Nation." Sites include historic buildings, battlefields, missions, landscapes, cemeteries, trails, archeological sites, and geologic formations important to the Nez Perce people. A total of 24 sites were established in 1965.

Public Law 102-576 of October 30, 1992, allowed sites to be designated in Oregon, Washington, Montana, and Wyoming. It specified that 14 additional sites in Idaho, Oregon, Washington, and Montana should be included in the park.

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DESCRIPTION These records document Nez Perce National Historical

Park's cultural and natural resource projects, including interpretive activities, museum and land management,

correspondence, and park publications.

Most notably, this collection contains documents collected by Rachael Maines and Associates in 1995 to assist the park in writing the Nez Perce NHP administrative history. Ms. Maines was contracted to review, organize and catalog records deemed to have lasting historical value in describing the administration and management of Nez Perce NHP. Although the collection was not used to write Nez Perce National Historical Park: Administrative History by Ted Catton, it became the basis of this archival collection.

Additional records selected for permanent retention in the future will be accessioned into this collection as they

become available.

#### **PROCESSING NOTES**

The collection was arranged and processed during FY 2002 by Jeffrey A. Johnson, Ph.D. student at Washington State University, under the direction of Robert Applegate, Nez Perce NHP Archivist.

The order imposed by Rachael Maines was revised to better reflect Nez Perce NHP administrative history and to facilitate location of materials by staff and researchers. Some material copied from other institutions by Ms. Maines was deemed inappropriate for the NEPE Museum Archives. This material was deposited in the NEPE Library.

The material in this collection produced by or under the direction of the DOI/NPS/NEPE is arranged in a manner consistent with subject headings found in NPS-19, the NPS Records Management Disposition Schedule. Additional material not produced by the government is found under these headings to further document Nez Perce NHP administrative history. Remaining material is arranged under logical series headings.

Duplicate materials, staples, and fasteners were removed. Acidic and damaged paper was photocopied and removed.

In 2006, an accretion of 25.75 resource management records was added to the collection. These records were added to:

Series IV: Correspondence; Series VIII: Museum Activity;

Series X: Site Files;

and Series XII: Publications.

The finding aid was revised to reflect these changes in FY 2009 by Sara Casper, Archives Technician.

In FY 2011, an accretion of central files records was added to the NEPE Resource Management Records Collection NEPE catalog # 33871 as Series XIII, NEPE Central Files. This accretion consisted of 17 linear feet of NEPE permanent records including 16 linear feet from NEPE central files and 1 linear foot of Canoe Camp expansion project files. The chronological range of the collection stretches from 1963-2010, with the bulk of the material created at NEPE between 1965 - 1998

#### SERIES DESCRIPTIONS

#### I. History, 1936-1999

This series is divided into four sub-series. The material in each sub-series is arranged chronologically.

Subseries 1: Background, 1936-1983

Included are newspaper clippings on the establishment of the park, preliminary research on the possibility of park establishment, and correspondence in the early stage of park planning.

Subseries 2: Planning, 1958-1999

This subseries covers planning correspondence and documents from 1958 to 1999. Topics include resource management, legislation, and visitor's center plans.

Subseries 3: Proposals, 1960-1987

Legislation for the establishment of Nez Perce National Historical Park, site additions, and proposal correspondence.

Subseries 4: Reports, 1946-1993

Preliminary reports on lands intended for park use. Also – more contemporary NPS reports on park structures, landscapes, and resources (i.e. LCS, HRS, HSR).

#### II. Agreements, 1967-1995

This series contains a wide variety of Memorandum of Understanding, Memorandum of Agreements, Cooperative Agreements, and Interagency Agreements. The agreements are primarily between NEPE and other federal agencies, institutions, or individuals. The agreements cover from 1967 to 1995 and center on NEPE lands, museum activity, and local cooperatives. The series is arranged by the type of agreement and alphabetically thereafter.

#### III. Archeology, 1967-1988

This series contains documents recording archeological finds, surveys, and research relating to park sites. The series is arranged chronologically.

#### IV. Correspondence, 1965-1998

This series is divided into two subseries.

This subseries consists of park correspondence from 1965 to 1989, including duplicates of letters and correspondence sent by NEPE staff to other parks, offices, or federal agencies. Arranged chronologically, the subseries is comprised of chronos and grouped according to destination.

#### Subseries 2: Superintendent Files, 1990-1998

These are the files kept by Park Superintendents documenting their day-to-day activities and exchanges with the public, and with other NPS officials. They were added to the collection as part of the 2006 accretion.

#### V. Interpretive Files, 1970-1995

This series contains documents specific to interpretation of park sites and the planning of exhibits. Specifically, the series contains mainly documents relating to NEPE wayside exhibits. The series is arranged chronologically, then alphabetically.

#### VI. Land, 1935-1988

This series contains files on NEPE lands, specifically records of compliance, land acquisition, water issues, and testing/surveys. The series also contains documents specific to the Nez Perce Tribe and the relationship between tribal lands and NPS land. The series is arranged chronologically, then alphabetically.

#### VII. *Maintenance*, 1955-1993

This series contains documents of management, structure and otherwise. Also, specific files on the maintenance and care of individual sites are in this series. The series is arranged chronologically.

#### VIII. Museum Activity, 1942-1996

This series is divided into two subseries.

#### Subseries 1: Museum Management, 1955-1992

This subseries contains records of museum planning and research. The files of the museum staff and especially park curator pertain to the Spalding Visitor's Center and other park sites. Curator's files contain exhibit plans, including text and photograph strategies. Aside from surveys and collection appraisals, the files contain materials on curatorial objects, sites, and correspondence. The subseries is arranged alphabetically, then chronologically.

#### Subseries 2: Spalding-Allen Collection, 1942-1996

This subseries includes correspondence and records associated with the purchase of the Spalding-Allen collection of artifacts. These records were added to the collection as part of the 2006 accretion.

#### Subseries 3: Spalding Museum Foundation, 1939-1983

This subseries includes correspondence, meeting minutes, surveys, financial records, newspaper clippings and photographs documenting the Spalding Museum Foundation's activities. Most notably, the records trace the foundation's involvement in funding and building the current Visitor's Center and its exhibits. The records were added to the collection as part of the 2006 accretion, and are arranged chronologically.

#### IX. Natural Resource Files, 1969-2000

This series contains records of park vegetation and natural resource management. In addition, files cover grazing, soil, and wildlife issues. This series is arranged by project.

#### X. Site Files, 1927-1995

This series contains the general park files maintained for the differing park sites. Site files pertain, in different instances, to both Individual structures and larger park sites. The series is grouped according to area (for multiple sites in one area) and afterward by individual sites. The 2006 accretion added inventories and other records dealing with Nez Perce National Historical Park's takeover of the Watson Store to this series.

#### XI. Ephemera, 1956-1993

This series contains various peripheral items. Pamphlets from various eras and events, assorted newspaper clippings, and miscellaneous park photographs are contained in the series. Also, the series holds a number of guestbooks both before and after the park's establishment. This series is arranged alphabetically.

#### XII. Publications, ca. 1995

This series contains the NEPE Administrative History written by Ted Catton of Historical Research Associates. The publication was added to the collection as part of the 2006 accretion of records.

#### XIII. NEPE Central Files, 1962-2010

This series contains NEPE central files compiled by park staff and deemed permanent by the National Park Service Records Disposition Schedule. Series XIII is divided into nine subseries with each subseries corresponding to categories specified in NPS-19 Appendix B.
