Project Abstract:

The Mountain Prairie Information Node (MPIN) http://mpin.nbii.gov> encompasses the broad geographic area of six states: Kansas, Montana, Nebraska, North Dakota, South Dakota, and Wyoming. As a regional information service, MPIN will support the NBII Program's mission to increase access to available scientific data and information for federal, state, and local agencies, universities, non-governmental organizations, and the public.

The MPIN project has five main components, guided by the goals of the draft strategic plan: 1) identify and engage key stakeholders and partners within the MPIN region; 2) acquire and provide access to biological and natural resource data, information, and related tools to users and stakeholders throughout the MPIN region; 3) brand and develop support for MPIN as the primary source of authoritative information about natural resources in the Mountain Prairie region; 4) develop a MPIN capacity in staffing, infrastructure, and capability that enables MPIN to work towards being a sustainable and fully operational Node; and 5) support the NBII Program and other Nodes.

Outcomes with completion dates (reports, publications, workshops, videos, etc.):

The primary outcomes are 1) an engaged group of regional stakeholders and partners, including a completed strategic plan (June 2007); 2) a user friendly, stakeholder/partner driven NBII MPIN web site (http://mpin.nbii.gov) with associated content items, databases, web applications, and external project web sites (June 2007); 3) two complimentary projects that leverage the NBII effort with supporting funds and further the NBII MPIN brand (June 2007); 4) staffing expertise in informatics, GIS, and science content development and an initial, robust, and secure distributed cyberinfrastructure supporting MPIN projects (June 2007); and, 5) support for the NBII program and Nodes through cooperative projects, workshops, and shared expertise (June 2007).
