Project goals: The project goals are to (1) understand changes in incidents over time; (2) evaluate communication content, sources, information distribution and visitor information reception; and (3) collaborate with partners during a focus group to share study results, communication strategies, and perceived effectiveness of communication strategies.

Project objectives: The expected result of the project is to understand wildlife-human conflict patterns and mitigation efforts at a landscape scale in the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem. The objectives of the project are to present longitudinal trends of wildlife-human incidents across the landscape, to improve the understanding of the effectiveness of bear safety communication strategies implemented across the GYE, and to share findings with stakeholders and provides a mechanism to increase effective communication around the wildlife-human safety issues across the GYE.
